In this course we will study the metabolic system, the regulatory system, the cardiorespiratory system and the neuromuscular system as they relate to physiologic response to endurance exercise and training effects. The focus of this course will be on development of testing protocols to measure human endurance capacities and the development of training regimes in order to improve performance during a wide range of endurance events that last for several minutes to several days.

For example, President Kennedy's famous Presidential Inaugural Address, Martin Luther King's famous "I Have a Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, FDR's famous Pearl Harbor address to the nation, Robert Kennedy's remarks on the assassination of Martin Luther King, and Lyndon Baines Johnson's "We Shall Overcome" address to Congress. Students would study the political atmosphere of the country, the setting for the speech, the speaker's use of rhetoric to maximize their intended meaning, and how these speeches changed the face of the United States.</p>
